Ali in Bahamas for million meal project



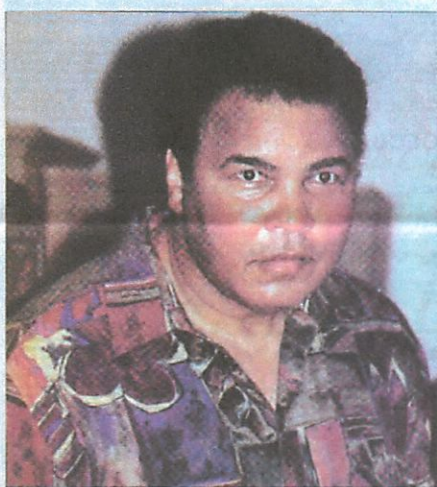

ONE million meals will be provided for needy Bahamians over the next 12 months thanks to boxing legend Muhammad Ali and international musician Yank Barry.

For the past seven years, Mr. Barry and Muhammad Ali have fed over 200 million people through Global Village Charities, a sickle-sponsored project.

Mr. Barry was involved in the "We are the World" project which raised millions of dollars to combat world hunger over two years ago.

Mr. Barry hosted a warm reception for "the Greatest" at his home in Oak Fort Bay. He said Mahomed

Ali was chosen for the project because he is still the most recognizable person in the world and he has the biggest heart.

The organization's plans to host world hunger is not restricted to one project.

There is also a Global Village in Liberia.

"What we are doing is adopting kids and thereby taking care of them year-round," he said.

Mr. Barry said that compared to having 20,000 people in countries like Rwanda for a week, it has proved more effective to feed smaller groups year-round.

A full-time Bahamian resident, Mr. Barry said that he also helped to

do some exceptional things in the Caribbean "for the sake of bringing this debilitating social concern."

The reception was also used to highlight the Muhammad Ali Centre in Louisville, Kentucky.

"Several people here are going to be attending an event later this year on November 17, hosted by Billy Crystal and Whoopi Goldberg," Mr. Barry said.

The Muhammad Ali Centre highlights the boxer's life and what he has done such as ending hunger.

The centre is expected to touch and inspire students. The state-of-the-art exhibition combines learning and fun and appeal to the mind, body and spirit, said Mr. Barry.
